We object to RIEL's "request" to separate the proceedings into two motions. RIEL is telling you how the landowners feel. As landowners, we did not give them the authority to speak for us.

Furthermore, the voluntary easements signed are still at less than 15%. That tells me that the people, the landowners have spoken.

85% are saying no to this project and no to the use of eminent domain. RIEL's "request" does not read like a "request". It reads more like an order from a higher up telling the IUB - "This is what we expect from you".

~~≡~~ We do not believe that among the 85% who have not signed an easement - that many will just sign with your decision to allow this - that they are just waiting for your go ahead.

I have also heard that some among the 15% who have signed - did so due to fear of eminent domain. They were told that they might as well sign.

Cont. -

We spoke to an elderly woman from West Bend area who felt bullied by the RIEL agent. She had not signed at that time and hope she stood her ground.

Separating these proceedings as RIEL "request" is NOT in the best interest of the land owners. It takes away from our constitutional rights as private property owners in Iowa and the U.S.A.
